Evidence assessed is:

Covid-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and airways. It is caused by a virus called Coronavirus. Symptoms can be mild, moderate, severe, or fatal. This is a generic Risk Assessment for dealing with the current Covid-19 situation in returning to face-to-face training and assessments for students. It is not likely to cover all scenarios and individuals should consider their own unique circumstances.

This Risk Assessment will be shared with staff, the leisure centre venues and will be available on Amac's website for information to students.

If anyone on a course becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they must be sent home (avoiding public transport) and advised to follow guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection, which sets out that they must self-isolate for at least 10 days and should arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19). 		Managing director will maintain regular contact with staff members during this time to reassure and support tutors in a fast-changing situation. If anyone should become unwell with Covid-19 whilst attending a course, they should be removed, if possible, to a room where they can be isolated behind a closed door whilst awaiting collection/suitable transportation home. Ideally a window should be opened for ventilation. 29.08.20 Amac will have a small number of hometesting kits that we can give directly to students who develops symptoms whilst attending a face-to-face course. These tests are for exceptional circumstances that you believe you will have difficultly or barriers accessing a test elsewhere. If advised that a student or tutor or general public at the venue has developed Covid-19 and they were recently in attendance on course or at the venue, Amac will work with the venue management in contacting PHE to discuss the case, identify people who have been in contact with them and will take advice on any actions or precautions that should be taken. 29.08.20 In event of confirmed case, Amac will contact PHE Kent Health Protection Team on 03442 253 861. In this situation, based on the advice from the health protection team, all those people attending the same course will be sent home. Everyone must self-isolate for 14 days. 		Conference calls used instead of face to face meetings. Form a 'bubble' for the duration of the training course by keeping the group separate from others in the building/venue (as far a reasonably possible). This is in addition to maintaining social distance between individuals as both measures will help. Staggered or limited amounts of moving around the course venues to help maintain a 2-metre distance. Teaching areas have been re/arranged to allow as much space between individuals as practical. Appropriate resources are available within the teaching areas e.g. gym equipment, furniture, portable fitness equipment. NB: sharing of equipment should be limited to the 'bubble'. Shared materials and surfaces should be cleaned and disinfected more frequently Resources for students, such as training manuals will be posted in advance to avoid the need for paperwork/portfolios/manuals etc to be 'handed out' on course.
